Congratulations, Joe!

Joe will be ordained priest at WInchester cathedral this Saturday evening - what better than to watch on line before the big match at 8pm?!

Becoming a 'rev' is a two stage process, with a year as a deacon where the emphasis is on serving and reaching out into the community, followed by ordination as priest. As a priest Joe will now be able to preside at communion.

Cliff and I were ordained priests exactly 4 years ago today. For me, the words in the service that best summed up what being a priest meant were these:

'May God, who anointed the Christ with the Holy Spirit at his baptism, anoint and empower you to reconcile and bless his people.'

Of course while some are called to the specific role as church leader (or of course, prison chaplain), as believers, we are all priests meaning that we all have direct access to God through Jesus. We're all called to the work of reconciliation (to God and each other), and to blessing God's people.

As we celebrate Joe's specific calling to ordained priesthood this weekend, let's not forget our own calling to help others know God's love and purpose for their lives.

Generous Ju-ly?

At the end of our series of Talks on 'Generous June' I asked if you would review your giving to the church. That might mean putting it down or up or starting to give regularly.

We are so grateful to all who give - we can't do this without you! - and especially that here at St Francis, we are good at responding to specific requests. Like every organisation though, we set a budget in the first quarter of the year. Ideally our regular giving would cover budgeted expenses. That's where we struggle - every month our income is below that budgeted. Of course that means, rightly, that we need to cut our cloth accordingly - and keep letting you know the needs we have. If you'd like more detail, our treasurer prepares a report for our Council meetings and those minutes are available for all to see - just ask.

Just a reminder that the money you give enables:

Ministry and mission: services of worship, junior church, craft bags and activities, Messy church, creche, youth group, alpha courses, other courses, obstacle courses (theoretically), supporting families around funerals, welcoming families at baptisms and giving them gifts, providing worship for the school. pastoral support for staff, contributions to lessons, training others in ministry including BCMs, LLMs, chaplains, eco-warriors, prayer warriors, pastoral ninjas, GP chaplains, Take Timers, safeguarders, lead ministers, curates, a totally fab administrator, cleaner, running a café and offering as much hospitality as is reasonably possible to as many as possible

Maintaining and heating (and painting) a building that not only gives us a place to meet and worship (pandemics notwithstanding) but also gives so many opportunities to bless our community as it's used by the school/ community association/ patient participation group/ café/ countless pastoral encounters

Tech support like AV, our social media presence, website, database, paying copyright licence fees, resources for sung worship, Zoom subs, videoclips for worship and teaching

Other churches and charities near and far to also flourish in their mission, too.

Developing your gifts - get fired up!

This coming autumn term the Winchester School of Mission will be offering four BCM programmes. BCM aims to equip and inspire lay people who feel a calling to, or have already stepped into, an area of ministry in their local church.

We would particularly like to bring to your notice the opportunity to take BCM Youth & Children's Ministry as this BCM is only available on an occasional basis.

A number of people at St Francis have taken part and found them really enjoyable, an opportunity to meet like-minded people and further equip themselves to serve where they feel called. BCM Worship (Into God's presence):

For those who have a desire to lead God's people into God's presence. The training will cover the core skills required to lead worship in your church/community and on completion carries an authorisation to lead non eucharistic worship more than once a quarter at the discretion of your incumbent.

BCM Youth & Children's Ministry:

This is primarily for those who are leading any form of youth or children's ministry in the church. The training will provide you with a range of creative ideas for building a strong ministry team.

BCM Prayer Champions (Creating a climate of Prayer):

This aims to equip you to encourage prayer in your church and community. It will build your personal confidence in prayer and offer you a variety of ideas to help others grow in prayer.

BCM Creation Care (Practical Stewardship):

This is for those who want to help their church steward the world's natural resources. It will consider the theology of our calling to care for God's creation, as well as exploring practical steps churches can take.

For most prisoners, the hardest period of their lives starts the day they are released.

Some ex-prisoners are returning to south Hampshire and have asked for a Christian volunteer to support them.



Statistics show that, on average, 46% of ex-prisoners will re-offend within one year of release. **BUT** – this figure reduces significantly if someone takes a personal interest in their rehabilitation. Ex-prisoners benefit from emotional support, practical help and wise guidance. Having a 'mentor' can help them rebuild their lives and give hope for a different outcome. A little of your time (2-3 hours/week) can change the direction of a life.



Area churches are working with a Hampshire Christian charity to bring <u>hope</u> to those living in our <u>local</u> community who are truly marginalised and <u>feel like</u> outcasts. There is currently a waiting list of those requesting support.

COULD YOU HELP? Volunteer mentors inevitably find that service in this work is a fulfilling part of their own faith journey. If you want to explore the idea of using your life skills in this vital ministry, please consider attending an **Open Evening on Zoom** in late June / early July (with no commitment) to find out more.
