This is to raise awareness of around 136,000 people who are estimated to be trapped in modern slavery in the UK, including many in our local area.



#### A letter from Sarah McClelland to our regular church family...

Dear friend,

Each year at Harvest, we take time to thank God for how he has provided for us. This year we can celebrate the opportunity to be together again. Rather than 'back to normal' we're navigating new territory with all the opportunities that presents, as well as some challenges! One of our challenges is a budget deficit and so I'm writing to you if you're a regular member of our church family, with a request for financial support, if you are able.

We started the year with a request for funds to put in an AV system that could support our hybrid services and we have been able to do that, thankfully. It is great to be able to share in worship both on Zoom and in the building and that option will continue. We've redecorated the church and received a gift specifically towards that, which we're really grateful for. None the less, we find ourselves with a budget deficit of £6500 in our accounts to end of August 2021.

This might sound like a similar refrain! We have been here before because our regular giving just doesn't keep up with our costs. I believe that we have budgeted sensibly and you would be welcome to see for yourself - the figures are available from Andrew Grove, our treasurer, at treasurer@stfrancis-valleypark.org.uk.

This Harvest time, I'm asking you to prayerfully consider two things:

- l. pledging a one-off sum in addition to your regular giving, to be used to help to meet the budget deficit and
- 2. starting to give regularly to St Francis Church, Gift aiding if appropriate.

As a church we are about so much more than asking for money! But in order to continue in our mission to be a blessing to our community, we need your help at this time. Thank you so much for considering this request.

# "The Lord will fight for you, you only have to stand still (Exodus 14:14)"

A couple of weeks ago, Mary Thomas preached for us on 'Power for the journey.' Many of us really appreciated her words, and I have copied the end of the talk below - do ask me or Mary if you'd like the full copy.

'Like the people of Israel, we need to be discerning about what we carry with us as we move forward. There are treasures that we need to take as part of our ongoing journey, and baggage that we probably need to leave behind.

I wonder what that looks like for you?

In all of this, let us remember to be kind to ourselves and to each other.

It is hard to face an unknown future and that was what the people of Israel were doing. Their squabbling came from fear of the unknown. I believe that is also what adds to our uneasiness now.

The huge message for us is carried with us as the People of God, in the big 'God Story'.

We can trust God to be there for us, to guide us forward in ways that we don't yet see.

We can go back to scripture and see how God has worked through the prophets, through Jesus Christ, his death and resurrection, through the first Christians, and through those who have nurtured our faith over the years.

Let us journey together knowing that this is the God who is with us!'
