### We have a new cross!

Joe has used his carpentry skills to make us a beautiful, simple wooden cross that's up in the Worship area. We'd love to pursue the possibility of a cross that the whole church family can contribute to - when we're able to be together again . In the meantime this simple cross will help to focus our worship. Thanks so much, Joe.

Joe writes,'I was surprised when I arrived at St. Francis back in October, to find that there was no cross on the wall at the front of church. As it is such a focal point for worship, I instantly offered to Sarah to make a temporary one whilst a more permanent crucifix was agreed. After a while my offer was accepted and I set to on working out how to produce a cross.

When I started working out where to cut the wood it quickly occurred to me how vital the proportions are. The cross is such an iconic symbol that we see everywhere in churches and on jewellery. If the dimensions were wrong it would be instantly noticed and look odd. It wasn't my intention to make anything extravagant.


The cross where Jesus was tortured and executed would not have been glamorous. I'm sure it would have been covered and stained from the blood and filth of the previous people unfortunate enough to have encountered it. I then set to work, sawing the timbers and chiselling out the joint. At times I found this emotional.

I think it would be impossible to make a cross like this and not think of the pain and torment that Jesus would have gone through in the hours before and during his time on the cross. When striking the chisel into the wood it was hard not to imagine the roman

striking the chisel into the wood it was hard not to imagine the roman soldier driving the nails through the flesh of our King, and what he went through for each of us.

I am pleased that the wall at the front of the church is no longer empty, and there is now a visual focus for us during worship. I hope you find this cross a suitable temporary measure whilst a more permanent fixture is decided upon.

Like so many times in life, what I thought was a simple straight forward job turned out to be more of an event than I was expecting which drew me closer to, and in deeper relationship with Him. What will you be doing over the next few weeks and coming year to take your relationship closer with God?'


